





Adjective/Adverb	Comparative	Superlative

big	bigger	the biggest
pretty	prettier	the prettiest
friendly	more friendly	the most friendly
beautiful	more beautiful	the most beautiful
exciting	more exciting	the most exciting
good/well	better	the best
bad/badly	worse	the worst
many/much	more	the most


