# Starry Night

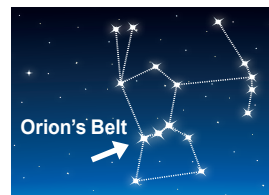

Jenny likes to see stars. She lies down on the grass and looks up at the sky. The black sky is full of stars. A group of stars **forms** a pattern and looks like a picture. It is called a **constellation**. Constellations can look like people, animals, or things.

Jenny finds three bright stars **in a row**. Those stars are called Orion's Belt. Orion is the shape of a hunter from long ago.

Over there is the Big Dipper! It has seven **shining** stars, so it is easy to find. It is shaped like a big spoon. It is always **located** high in the sky on summer nights.

Now Jenny wants to find the Little Dipper. ( a ) Its stars are **faint**, so she **looks for** Polaris first. ( b ) Polaris, also known as the North Star, is the brightest star in the Little Dipper. ( c ) There it is! The Little Dipper looks just like its name. ( d ) It is so much fun to look at the **starry** night sky.
